

### 2. Where We Work

Alameen Officially licensed in many countries such as The United Kingdom, Sweden, The United States, and Turkey. These main offices are officially registered with a charity status facilitating the advocacy activities, fundraising opportunities, and spreading our cause loudly everywhere we can.

Alameen has been also involved in humanitarian responses as operational missions in Turkey, Syria, Lebanon, Yemen, Somalia, Palestine, Sudan, Iraq, Ukraine, Armenia, Greece, Poland, Egypt and Djibouti over the past years. In these mission offices, Alameen coordination teams operating coordination and collaboration with local authorities, providing services through three main Humanitarian programs: Health and Nutrition, Protection and Education, and Emergency Response.



## Our Sustainability Contributions

Alameen's goals align with the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals for 2030, focusing on providing services based on global standards and protocols tailored to the contexts of local communities. All services, projects, and working modules are designed and operated to be compatible with specific goals agreed upon for sustainable development. Mainly the following goals:

Service delivery models are diverse, tailored to the needs of local communities, and ensure full coordination and collaboration with all stakeholders. These needs are professionally assessed using both primary and secondary data, following a thorough reporting process that spans from data collection to analysis. Alameen boasts a specialized Data and Needs Assessment Unit (DNA), responsible for producing detailed periodic reports.

The Data and Need Assessment Unit (DNA) is committed to providing information and research-backed support. Alameen has been able to Develop a multitude of comprehensive needs assessments and scenario reports on different areas in countries we have access to, providing background information to aid in better coordination with valuable research. in addition to developing programs and enhancing the effects of project implementation.

## 5 Alameen Programs & Services Modules

Alameen operates primarily through three programs, aligned with the UNOCHA's clusters and coordination structure.

Each program contains many intervention modules. For the health and nutrition program, Alameen provides lifesaving and relief health services through fixed or mobile primary care centers, hospitals, specialized centers, such as dialysis centers, disabilities rehabilitation centers, blood banks, and so on. In addition to coordinating with health stakeholders in providing immunization, nutrition, referral, and networking.

In the education and protection program, Alameen provides services through fully or partially supporting specialized centers or support activities outdoor through mobile clinics for camps or communities.

For any other relief aid, Alameen works under the umbrella of the emergency response program to provide food or sanitation baskets, non-food items, shelter requirements, water and sanitation buckets, or any other services according to the needs.

Alameen provides services through 63 Health Facilities. following international protocols in many ways as well as geographical areas. the following list names these services briefly:



#### 5.1.1. Fixed and Mobile Primary Health Care Facilities:

Alameen in 2024 fully operates 36 PHC centers distributed in 4 missions and provides services through multiple clinics such as Nutrition, BEmONC, Reproductive Health, Communicable diseases, non-communicable diseases, pediatrics, and dentistry in addition to laboratory and pharmacy.





We provide +81.000 consultations/monthly for +70.000 patients. Through 526 specialized staff members.



#### 5.1.2. Hospitals

Alameen in 2024 fully operates 7 Hospitals and leads a network of health actors who operate about 45 health facilities.



We provide +68.600 consultations/monthly for +60.000 patients. 620 specialized staff members.








#### 5.1.3. Dialysis Centers

Alameen in 2024 fully operates 5 Dialysis Centers in 3 missions. Which provides +2300 dialysis sessions monthly. To 220 patients.




















#### 5.1.4. Disabilities Rehabilitation Centers:

Alameen in 2024 fully operates 11 Centers that provide services such as prostheses and orthosis, rehabilitation of amputees, and physiotherapy in addition to auditory services in 3 missions.


#### 5.1.5. Immunization

Alameen is a reliable official partner that responds to pandemic and endemic crises such as COVID-19, Polio, Measles, Cholera, Tuberculosis, and so on.

We used to provide EPI for +2200 children monthly. We provided about 2.9 M Cholera vaccines, 1.2 M Polio and measles vaccines, and 0.4 COVID-19 vaccines during the last 3 years.



















#### 5.1.6. Nutrition

Alameen Provides nutrition services through most health facilities by specialized nutritionists and community health workers. We scan the community, following IYCF and other relevant protocols. And distribute nutrition materials for both children and mothers following precise nutrition plans.

Our specialized staff provides nutrition services in 12 different facilities.

#### 5.1.7. Health Networking

Alameen leads a health network in NWS which consists of 45 health facilities such as hospitals, PHCs, blood banks, dialysis centers, and TB centers. +200.000 patients are directly or indirectly served monthly from Alameen.


























## **5.2. Education & Protection Program**

#### 5.2.1. Education

Alameen implements several educational projects to raise the quality of Education and increase safe access to education for children and support teachers and administrative staff alike.

The services provided include operation costs, capacity building, and raising awareness for both teachers and students in addition to rehabilitation of educational infrastructure.



















#### 5.2.2. Protection

Alameen provides services related to child protection, gender-based violence, family tracing, mine action awareness, women empowerment, and psycho-social support. Our specialized staff provides Psycho-social support services in 10 different facilities.

Alameen also provides mental health services through specialized MHPSS centers, mobile clinics, or integrated clinics within other health facilities.

All services provided are following the trusted international guidelines and protocols that agreed with the protection stakeholders in the coordination bodies.



















### 5.3. Emergency Response Program

Alameen's operations are committed to addressing humanitarian emergencies and responding promptly to crises from natural disasters or conflicts.

Our services are tailored to meet specific needs, encompassing shelter, WASH (Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene), non-food items, and food baskets.

#### 5.3.1. Epidemics:

Alameen responded to the COVID-19 epidemic and cholera endemic by providing vaccination services and hygiene kits to local communities in the areas working in.

We also provided raising awareness activities and medications for Malaria, Dengue fever, and leishmaniasis.



#### **5.3.2.** Natural Catastrophes

Alameen responded to natural catastrophes like floods and snowstorms which negatively impacted the local communities. Through Health, NFI and FSL services.

Recently, Alameen responded to the catastrophic Turkey-Syria earthquake, which inflicted widespread damage across communities. We responded through Health, NFI, FSL, and WASH activities in both Turkey and Syria.

We currently manage 20 mobile clinics and provide support to 40 health facilities by supplying medications and consumables and facilitating medical assistance to +218,000 patients.
